Welcome Preparations Underway for New House



Senior Officers engaged with the Bougainville House of Representatives currently preparing to welcome the new House and preparing for the induction of the newly elected Members of the fourth House.

Following the announcement 2. Return of Writs by the Bougainville Electoral Commissioner George Manu of the tentative 2020 ABG General Elections Schedule, the staff of the Bougainville House of Representatives are currently doing preparatory work to welcome the new House.

The senior management team under directives from the Clerk and the Deputy Clerk have taken the responsibility to mobilize and delegate tasks to Parliamentary Service staff to host the following events;

1. Issue of Writs

- 3. Swearing in of the President and Caretaker BEC
- 4. First Meeting of the 4th House and Swearing in of the newly elected Members
- 5. Induction of Members, and
- 6. Induction of political appointees (Secretaries, Research Officers and Executive officers)

As the head of Parliamentary Service, the Clerk Robert Tapi said the forthcoming events call for the involvement of his officers in programs that will be delivered at the Parliament

House or a venue to be decided by the incoming government.

The Bougainville Events Committee will also play an important role in facilitating funding and overseeing the preparations for the incoming government.

As far as the Members and Ministerial staff programs are concerned, the Clerk stressed the importance of the content of information and how it will be disseminated to the Members during the induction.

Looking Back: Moving Forward (Part 1)

Background

When Parliament adjourned for the last time on Friday March 20 this year, the Speaker of the House Hon Simon Pentanu went on air via Radio Ples Lain and announced that he will be issuing writs for the 2020 election of the Bougainon Friday, March 27 2020 in consistent with Section 107 of the Bougainville Constitution.

The Speaker mentioned that his decision is subjected to any court injunction that may be pending in court.

After being briefed and given an election schedule by the Bougainville Electoral Commissioner George Manu, the Speaker was also conscious that Bougainvilleans and the general public will be aware that the President of the Autonomous Bougainville Government and the Bougainville Executive Council have filed a Special Supreme Court Reference challenging the validity of sections 89(2), and 91(4) (f) of the Bougainville Constitution.

The reference also seeks a ruling as to whether the provision of section 55(5) (b) regarding the lawful status of former combatants of the House impacted on the outcome of a vote to amend Sec-February 21, 2020.
